Data Breach Policy and Public Notification Register

Metropolitan Memorial Parks

Part 6A of the Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998 (NSW) (the PPIP Act) sets out the obligations of public sector agencies, which includes Metropolitan Memorial Parks, in relation to data breaches involving personal information. These obligations include a requirement to prepare and publish a data breach policy and to keep a register of public notifications made to affected individuals.

About the Data Breach Policy

Our <u>Data Breach Policy</u> outlines the approach that we will take in response to all data breach reports including a category of 'eligible' breaches that are defined within Part 6A of the PPIP Act, under Mandatory Notification of Data Breach (MNDB) Scheme provisions.

Register of Public Notifications

The PPIP Act requires us to keep a register of all public notifications of eligible data breaches and to make that register available on its website.

A public notification is provided when it is not reasonably practicable to notify any or all of the individuals affected by the breach directly.
